VISION, VALUES & AIMS

PUPIL ENTRY & EXIT TO/FROM SCHOOL

Almost all pupils have changed classrooms this year, so we felt that it was important to confirm where the children should be lining up in the morning and where they will exit the school building at the end of the school day.

Primary 1 and 2/1 will line up at the door at the bottom of their corridor and closest to their classrooms. Primary 2 and 3 will line up at the entrance closest to our ELC. Our Primary 4 and 5 children will line up at the bottom of the upper school corridor. Primary 6 and Primary 7 will line up at the entrance in the middle section of the playground. The children will line up in their House Groups and coloured cones have been placed in the playground this week to help the children identify where they should line up.

All children will exit from the doors in their classrooms. This avoids a bottleneck on exit from the school and ensures that the class teacher can see that children exit the building and are returned to their parents/ carers safely.

OUR IMPROVEMENT PRIORITIES

During session 2018-19 our improvement agenda includes three main priorities:

- Development of Early Level Literacy methodology
- Implementation of Languages 1+2 (French)
- Further development of Personal Learning Profiles (PLPs)

As well as these school priorities, staff will have leadership roles in taking forward Tweeddale Cluster priorities in:

- Raising attainment in mathematics, through the development of learning pathways.
- Ensuring the health and wellbeing of our pupils through engagement with restorative practices.
- Continue to build professional capacity in the moderation of reading, through engagement with and professional dialogue across the cluster.
