PARENT COUNCIL & FUNDING BID

As many of you will be aware, we are continuing to develop our school grounds and last week Ms Curson met with colleagues from Parks and Gardens to support long term planning around cutting hedges and trees back, improving the school entrance area on Deanfoot Road and also discussing further planned gardening work.

As well as this, we, with support from our Parent Council have made a bid to SBC for a polytunnel to be installed in our playground. If successful, the polytunnel will give pupils further opportunity for learning outdoors and to learn valuable skills regarding the journey of our food from 'Farm to Fork.'

NUT FREE SCHOOL

We would like to remind all school users that this year we have children and families with severe nut allergies (this includes peanut, cashew and various others.)

In August we asked for no nut products to be in school. We now further ask that all cereal/ fruit bars and snacks be checked before they are sent into school. Many of these snacks contain traces of nuts and unfortunately as a result are considered nut products.

We recently had an incident where a pupil with a nut allergy came into contact with a nut product. The incident was dealt with promptly and effectively, however we are very aware that anaphylaxis can come on suddenly and with grave outcomes. As such we must be very clear that no nut products can be consumed on the premises and thank you for your support with this.

CURRICULUM OVERVIEWS & PLPS

As you will see from the Parent Calendar received in August, your child's Term 2 Curriculum Overview will be shared on 30th October, along with your child's PLP (Personal Learning Plan).

As in previous years, we aim to share with you what your child is learning about in class and their journey towards targets in these areas. Your child's PLP will show some learning from Term 1 with evidence related to their learning targets in numeracy & mathematics, literacy & English; they will also contain evidence of learning across the curriculum. We would ask you to comment on evidenced work and to discuss your child's learning with them. There will be a sheet to fill in with your child, but be aware that this is only a guide for discussion and if you discuss something different then this is just as appropriate.

We would ask you to then return the PLPs to school on 2nd November.

PEEBLES YOUTH TRUST HAMPERS

You may already be aware that Peeblesshire Youth Trust (PYT) provides Christmas hampers to families across the Peeblesshire Community with children under the age of 16 who are likely to be struggling in a variety of different ways in the run up to and during the festive period.

Very sadly, the number of nominations PYT receive and hampers they deliver have increased year-onyear. COVID-19

As we learn more about COVID-19 and how it transmits in our communities across Scotland, we are continually revisiting and amending our Risk Assessment in School. As such there have been some additional changes which will affect your children. These are in line with the Scottish Government FACTS guidelines and we thought it was important that we share what that looks like at West Linton Primary School.

We remind all school users that you should only enter the school playground if you have to and that alternative pick up points should be considered. If in the playground to pick up one of our younger pupils please maintain a 2 metre social distance from any other adult, ensuring you are paying attention to those in front, behind and to each side.

F – Face Coverings in enclosed spaces: All staff in school will now wear a face covering (unless exempt) when they are travelling around the school. Teachers will wear a face covering when they are at the Meet and Greet in the morning and again when dismissing the pupils. The teachers may wear their face covering at other points in the day e.g. if they are working in close proximity to a pupil. (Close proximity constitute less than 2 metres.)





A – Avoid Crowded Places: Our playground, I'm sure you will agree is a crowded place and as such we will be zoning our playground to reduce the amount of pupils in any area at any time. The Zone Map is attached to this email for your information. The Active Trail and MUGA will have their own daily timetable to ensure that across the term all children are afforded an equitable, but safe experience.

C – Clean hands and surfaces regularly: The children here are now very used to washing hands on entrance into and exit from the school building. We will continue to do this and as such have added further sanitation points in the school building. We are fortunate to already have sinks in each classroom, but we have also installed a hand sanitation point at the end of the main corridor and at the exit from the dining hall into the playground.

T – Test if you have symptoms: All staff are aware of their obligation to arrange a test if they have any of the COVID-19 symptoms e.g. A loss/ change in taste or smell, a new persistent cough or a raised temperature. We would ask you to continue to be vigilant and keep your child off school and arrange a test if they have any of these. Where one member of a household is displaying symptoms and awaiting a test/test result everyone in the household must self-isolate. We appreciate that we are moving into the cold and flu period and that there will be an increase in coughs and sneezes, however we ask you to consider whether you can be sure that the cough is cold related, if you cannot, we would appreciate you arranging a test.

S – Self isolate if you have a positive test or you are asked to via Test and Protect: If you or any of your children receive a positive COVID-19 test, we would ask you to contact the school at your earliest convenience. This is in order that we can ensure the virus does not spread in our school. All members of the household must self-isolate. If you are contacted by the NHS Test and Protect team please follow their instructions on self-isolating/testing.

We have already discussed these measures with pupils during our weekly assembly, however appreciate your support in reiterating that the reason for these measures is to keep all children and adults in our school safe. Thank you.
