At West Linton Primary, we along with all schools in Scotland will be unable to have any of our large community events due to the risk of COVID-19 exposure. We are undeterred by this, and have started our planning for what we can offer to our young people so that they are able to 'get into the Christmas Spirit' but also remain safe in school.

Christmas lunches must be ordered on ParentPay by 30th November, so that we can plan for the usual increase in pupils having a school lunch that day. You should have already received a letter regarding this. If you have already chosen a lunch for that day, it will be cancelled and will have to be reordered with the Christmas menu.

INDOOR PE

Since we are a school in a Tier 2 local authority, we are now able to bring our PE indoors. As a result, the pupils will require indoor shoes for gym from now on.
