

WEST LINTON PRIMARY SCHOOL MARCH NEWSLETTER

WELCOME BACK

We are delighted to be welcoming back the whole school from ELC - Primary 7 from Monday 15th March. We would like to take this opportunity to thank all of you for supporting your children's learning during lockdown and for being patient with us, and the various technologies we have used to keep your child engaged in their learning. I would also like to give thanks to all of the staff who ensured that young people had learning to engage in and Class Meets to attend so that pupils continued to progress in their learning.

When we return next week, I know that some of you will be apprehensive, but we would like to reassure you that risk control measures have been considered and planned to ensure pupils return to a safe environment. With this in mind we would like to share some logistics with you so that you and your child are fully prepared for the return to school:

Pick up and drop off:

- As in previous communications, we respectfully ask that wherever possible pupils are dropped off and picked up, away from the school playground. We understand that our youngest pupils should continue to be picked up by an adult to ensure their safety, however older pupils should arrange a safe place to be picked up or walk home.
- ➤ If you are picking a pupil up from the school playground, we ask that only one adult per household attends, that you wear a face covering (unless exempt) and that you remain 2 metres socially distanced from any other adult or child from another family.
- At drop off time there is adequate supervision from school staff for children to be left in the playground without parental supervision from 8:40am onwards. If you are staying with your child until the bell we ask that you attend the playground as close to 8:50 as possible to avoid congestion. If your child is distressed, we would ask you to stay with your child and support in settling them before leaving.
- Pupils will be allocated a class zone whilst in the playground. This zone will be where they play at lunchtime and break time, as well as where they are dropped off and picked up.
- All children will enter and exit the school building via their classroom door.

Lunches:

Can we ask that you order pupil lunches on parent pay if you would like your child to have a school lunch. Advanced knowledge of orders supports us to organise the lunch service safely taking account of the maximum numbers of young people allowed in the dinner hall at any one time. Thank you.

Toys/ Outdoor activity from home

As in other communications, we ask that no toys or outdoor games/ balls come to school from home. This is to reduce contact between households and exposure to COVID-19 spread.

Inspire IPads

All P4-7 pupils should come to school on Monday with their IPad charged fully and ready to use in their learning.

PARENT EVENINGS

In consultation with staff and the Parent Council Chair, Louise Fraser, it has been agreed that the scheduled Parent Evenings will now take place on **Wednesday 28**th and Thursday 29th April instead of 24th and 25th March.

We have made this change so that class teachers can report on pupil progress whilst learning remotely, but also on their return to school. The additional few weeks will support us to complete benchmarking analysis and report on your child's strengths and areas for development.

You will also receive your child's PLP in June along with the Pupil as a Learner comment from your child's class teacher as usual.

ELC HOURS REVIEW

To continually support the families of West Linton, from August 2021 our ELC hours will be changing. Instead of only school hours, our ELC will be able to offer places to pupils aged 3-5 from 8:00am – 4:30pm Monday – Friday (term time only).



There are options available within these hours to have pupils attend for all or part of their 1140 hour entitlement. Alternatively if families require 8:00am – 4:30pm each day, there is an option to make a top-up payment to Scottish Borders Council in order that children can attend our West Linton ELC over and above the 1140 hour entitlement.
