Snack

Every day we are offered a different healthy snack. The menu for each week is emailed home and displayed in our ELC reception area. Snack money is collected on a termly basis. It is currently 50p per session.

We wash our hands before snack.

We then need to brush our teeth.







We can choose when we have our snack. We can also choose not to have a snack at all. We are encouraged to drink plenty of water and there is a water station for us to use.

Once we have had our snack we wash our own plates and cups then do our teeth.

Toilets

These are our toilets. They are at just the right height for you if you can manage by yourself. If you need any help, or are not quite ready to go to the toilet by yourself, there will always be an adult to help you.





Some days we will use the school Gym Hall and Library. We also join in with activities our friends in P1 are doing. This helps us when it is time to think about starting school.







At the end of each session we help to tidy up. We often read stories and sing songs as our parents/carers are being buzzed in to come and take us home.



The adults that help us are always happy to pass on information and answer questions before or after each session.

We also have our own Personal Learning Plans (PLPs) which we can look at and add to whenever we want. Our parents and carers are encouraged to share regularly in these as well.
