Unfortunately, there has been an increase in people bringing their dogs into our school grounds for walks and play. As a Scottish Borders Council school, there should be no dogs in the vicinity of the school building or on school grounds (except guide dogs).



Whilst we all love our four legged friends; dog's dirt can be very dangerous to young pupils, not to mention very difficult to get off shoes and clothes should they come into contact with it. Therefore, we ask that all dogs are secured at the front entrance at 'pick up' and 'drop off' if you must bring them to school. The same applies at the weekends and when school is not in session.

POLYTUNNEL

We are delighted to announce that our polytunnel has arrived. The polytunnel was bought using a central budget to support outdoor learning post Covid-19.

This session we have an outdoor learning working party, who among other things will be planning for the use of the polytunnel. Our hope is that this polytunnel will become a community resource and that other groups and clubs may also use it.

COVID-19 UPDATE

By now, you will have received a 'Warn and Inform' letter from school. This letter details that there are multiple positive cases of Covid-19 in our school community.

Whilst we appreciate that this may come with some concern, we would like to reassure all of our school users that we continue to follow a rigorous risk assessment in school. The Risk Assessment includes adults wearing face coverings, enhanced cleaning of busy areas and regular handwashing is scheduled for all young people and adults as they enter or exit the school or move into a different area in school.

We also only have fifty young people in the dining hall at any one time and continue to have young people who have brought lunches from home eating in their classroom. This is to ensure that pupil contact with others in minimised.

To keep our young people and staff safe, we continue to ask that **no toys or games** are brought in from home. This includes footballs, Pokémon cards and cuddly toys. Whilst we understand that restrictions are less strict in other clubs and community organisations, school guidelines remain largely unchanged.

We also continue to ask that **only one parent** come to the school playground at 'pick up' and 'drop off', if your attendance is crucial. If it is not, then please meet your child in a safe place off-campus. This is to reduce numbers in our school playground. Continue to maintain a two-metre distance from any other adult or child from outwith your household and we urge all adults attending the playground to wear a face covering, unless exempt. If you forget your face covering, there are spares in the school foyer. Thank you.

IPADS AND IPAD REPAIRS

Over the last few weeks, we have had some losses and accidental damage of SBC Inspire IPads reported to us at school. We are very understanding that accidents do happen, however any loss of Inspire Ipads or damage does come at a cost. The cost of a new iPad, should it be lost, is £260 and a new screen can cost up to £80. We understand the pressures this can place on families financially and therefore would always try to support the first incidence of accidental damage; however, loss of Ipads would be chargeable in full to families. To support, here are a couple of suggestions we can make - Firstly iPads can be kept in school to ensure that they are not carried around in school bags and into after school activities. Secondly, screen protectors can be purchased from the school at a cost of £11 each, please call the office if you would like to buy one.
