# **KEEPING OURSELVES SAFE**

As part of our ongoing discussions in class about keeping ourselves safe, we have our community Police Officer PC Serena Moody coming into school to deliver learning about drug and alcohol awareness and safety in the community in our upper school classes.

With the lighter evenings and better weather on the way, you may also want to give young people some reminders about letting you know where they are going, who they are with and what time they are due to be home.

You might for example want to encourage them to use tracking tools such as "FindMy phone" or similar tools on their device as a safety measure and to remember to keep enough charge in their phone/device so they can contact you if they need to or to let you know if they are going to be late.
