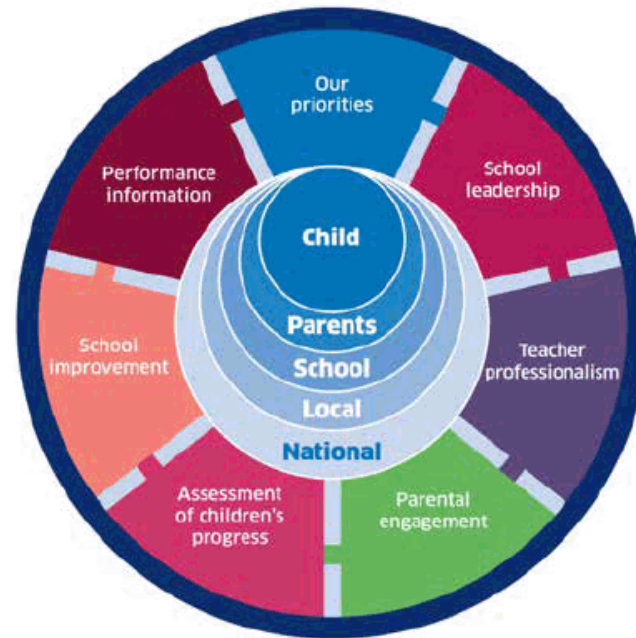
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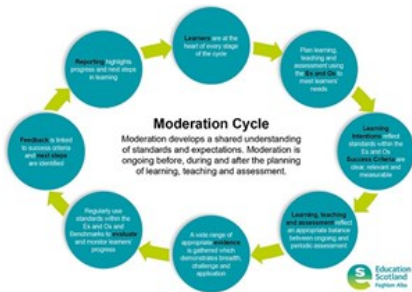
Your Child Matters—We are committed to Getting it Right for them.

At West Linton our main drivers for the Curriculum are Literacy, Numeracy & Health and Wellbeing for all.

Priority 1— #SBCWay—Implementing a consistent BGE Curriculum.

At West Linton Primary School we follow Curriculum for Excellence. We have worked hard to develop a curriculum which best suits your child’s needs and interests.

This year, we will continue to implement the #SBCWay with particular focus on planning and assessment in writing, mathematics & early level pathways to ensure all young people are on track to achieve anticipated National Levels.



At Cluster Level we will work with colleagues across Tweeddale (including Peebles High School and Partner and Voluntary nursery settings) to moderate standards in writing. This will include staff training and visiting other settings to observe lessons and share ideas.

Priority 2—Raising Attainment & Achievement

This session we will pilot a wider achievement tracking system to celebrate your child’s accomplishments throughout their school journey.



We will develop leadership skills in all of our young people, by beginning 'Our Pupils as Leaders' Groups. In consultation with our young people, the focus of these groups will be developing Sport across the school, including working towards a Gold level award from Sports Scotland. Groups will also consider the UNCRC articles related to play in their leadership groups.



Priority 3— Vision, Values & Aims refresh

Since it has been seven years since our Vision and Values were created in consultation with stakeholders, it is time to refresh and decide whether they are still fit for the core business and priorities in our school.



This year we will be asking for your support in adapting our Vision and Values, if we feel that this is required. Our current vision and values can be found on the front of this leaflet, on our school website and in the school handbook.

Our young people felt, at the end of the year, that Kindness, Respect and Honesty continue to be the factors important to them, but it is important that we hear from all of our stakeholders when we are considering what is important to us as a school community.
